Roll Call

FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS

Mr. Cassel called the meeting to order, and called the roll.

SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS

Approval of the Minutes of the October 21, 2019 Meeting

On MOTION by Mr. Okyn, seconded by Dr. Shank, with all in favor, the Minutes of the October 21, 2019 Meeting were approved.

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS Audience Comments

Installation of a dock at the laderosa property was addressed.

- The dock policy was discussed.
- If there is a hurricane warning, the boat may be removed from the canal at the property owners' cost.

On MOTION by Mr. Okyn, seconded by Dr. Shank, with all in favor, installation of a dock at the laderosa property was approved subject to the fact the dock may be removed from the canal in the event of a hurricane at the property owners' cost.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Approval of Financial Statements for October 2019

The Board reviewed the Financial Statements for October 2019.

• The amount in *Field*, belongs to both *Field* and *Plant*.

On MOTION by Mr. Okyn, seconded by Dr. Shank, with all in favor, the Financial Statements for October 2019 were approved.

FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Budget Amendments

A. Resolution 2020-2, Amending General Fund Budget for Fiscal Year 2018 – 2019

On MOTION by Mr. Okyn, seconded by Dr. Shank, with all in favor, Resolution 2020-2, Amending the General Fund Budget for Fiscal Year 2018 – 2019 was adopted.

B. Resolution 2020-3, Amending General Fund Budget for Fiscal Year 2019 – 2020

On MOTION by Mr. Okyn, seconded by Dr. Shank, with all in favor, Resolution 2020-3, Amending the General Fund Budget for Fiscal Year 2019 – 2020 was adopted.

C. Resolution 2020-4, Amending Water and Sewer Budget for Fiscal Year 2018 – 2019

On MOTION by Mr. Okyn, seconded by Dr. Shank, with all in favor, Resolution 2020-4, Amending the Water/Sewer Fund Budget for Fiscal Year 2018 – 2019 was adopted.

SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Encroachment Policy Consideration

This item was approved under Audience Comments.

- This item must be approved by the District Engineer.
- Mr. Lewis will draft a letter regarding removal of the boat when there is a hurricane warning.

Mr. Glen Hanks briefed the Board regarding 600 North University Drive.

- There have been numerous exchanges with the developer.
- They will likely have to come back to the Board to request a variance for the property.
- The applicants have confirmed they are not going to be able to achieve the necessary storage. It is up to them to propose a solution.

SEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of LMK Change Order #1 for Lift Station #2 Reducing the Original Project Cost of \$736,575 by \$92,458 for a Net Project Cost of \$644,117

On MOTION by Mr. Okyn, seconded by Dr. Shank, with all in favor, LMK Change Order #1 for Lift Station #2 Reducing the Original Project Cost of \$736,575 by \$92,458 for a Net Project Cost of \$644,117, was approved.

EIGHTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Purchase of a Chevy Silverado 2500 Long Bed Truck from Alan Jay Fleet Sales, Piggybacking Off the Florida Sheriff's Association Contract FSA19-VEL27.0

- Cruise control is a standard specification for the truck.
- The bottom line cost is \$39,285.

On MOTION by Mr. Okyn, seconded by Dr. Shank, with all in favor, purchase of a Chevy Silverado 2500 Long Bed Truck from Alan Jay Fleet Sales, piggybacking off the Florida Sheriff's Association Contract FSA19-VEL27.0 in the amount of \$39,285, was approved.

NINTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of an Award in the Amount of \$11,925 to Florida Fish Farms, Inc. for the Purchase of 2,650 Triploid Grass Carp, Piggybacking Off the Broward County Contract

On MOTION by Mr. Okyn, seconded by Dr. Shank, with all in favor, the purchase of 2,650 Triploid Grass Carp from Florida Fish Farms, Inc. in the Amount of \$11,925, piggybacking off the Broward County Contract, was approved.

TENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Hach as Sole Service Provider for Certain Instruments

- This is a contract for repair services.
- The instruments are in place, but require repairs.
- They are the only company which can repair or replace the parts.

On MOTION by Mr. Okyn, seconded by Dr. Shank, with all in favor, the proposal from Hach Service Plus as the sole service provider for certain instruments, was approved.

ELEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Consideration of Work Authorizations

- A. Work Authorization #168 for Membrane Valve Replacement
- This will reduce recovery to 60%. There will be more flushing across the membrane.
- This will increase the longevity of the membranes.
- It is difficult to determine how many more years the membranes will last.

Mr. Okyn MOVED to approve Work Authorization #168 for Membrane Valve Replacement for a total cost of \$156,325, and Dr. Shank seconded the motion.

- The District should be named as an additional insured party on the Florida Fish Farms contract, as well as all other policies.
- Mr. Lewis discussed the Florida Statute regarding public records. The language should be incorporated into all Work Authorizations.

There being no further discussion,

On VOICE vote, with all in favor, the prior motion was approved.

- B. Work Authorization #169 for Stormwater Pump Stations #1 and #2 Hurricane Hardening Design
- The work will be done within the appropriate time criteria.
- There is no reimbursement for the engineering work.
- The Board will be presented with a work authorization for additional construction services in January.

On MOTION by Mr. Okyn, seconded by Dr. Shank, with all in favor, Work Authorization #169 for Stormwater Pump Stations #1 and #2 Hurricane Hardening Design for a total cost of \$40,540, was approved.

TWELFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

RESOLUTION 2020 – 5

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE CORAL SPRINGS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT APPROVING UTILITY RATE MODIFICATIONS FOR WATER AND SEWER SERVICES TO BROWARD COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT FACILITIES LOCATED WITHIN THE IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT; PROVIDING FOR FUTURE MODIFICATIONS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 2004-469, Laws of Florida, the Board of Supervisors of the Coral Springs Improvement District (the "District") possesses the necessary statutory authority to establish rates and fees for potable water service and wastewater collection and disposal services within the District; and

WHEREAS, Broward County School District (the "School District") receives potable water service and wastewater collection and disposal services from the District for five schools located within the District; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 1013, Florida Statutes, the School District has the authority to pay for infrastructure and utility services such as potable water and wastewater collection and disposal, provided the School District only pays for its prorata share of such services; and

WHEREAS, the District staff has analyzed its water and sewer rate structure as it relates to the referenced School District facilities, has concluded that the District rate structure should be amended to provide a more equitable rate to the School District's facilities and has communicated the District proposal to School District staff; and

WHEREAS, School District staff has accepted the District's proposed rate structure for School District facilities within the District.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE CORAL SPRINGS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT:

Section 1. The recitals above are true and accurate and are hereby made a part of this resolution.

Section 2. Effective October 1, 2019, the base rate for potable water service for properties owned or operated by the School Board of Broward County shall be \$19.04 per ERC and \$03.61 per 1,000 gallons of use per ERC. The base rate for waste water collection and disposal service shall be \$19.04 per ERC and \$03.61 per 1,000 gallons of use per ERC.

Section 3. Beginning October 1, 2020, the District Board of Supervisors may increase all water and wastewater rates based on current or future methodology studies.

Section 4. The District Operations Manager or his/her field manager may request inspection of School District facilities by District staff to determine what if any modifications to School District facilities have been made that would affect District fee calculations. Any report generated shall be made available to School District staff.

Section 5. This resolution shall take effect upon passage by the Board of Supervisors of the Coral Springs Improvement District.

HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT FOR WAIVER FROM CORAL SPRINGS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT CANAL BANK STANDARDS

THIS HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into on this _____day of ______, 2019 by and between CORAL SPRINGS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT (hereinafter the "District") and CLP HARBOR INN OWNER, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company (hereinafter the "Permittee").

WHEREAS, the District, is a Special Improvement District organized under Florida Statute Chapter 189 for, amongst other purposes, the regulation of surface water within its boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the Permittee is the owner of certain real property located at 201 N. University Drive, Coral Springs, FL (hereinafter the "Subject Property"), and has requested approval of a storm water management plan for the Subject Property, and

WHEREAS, a portion of the canal within, or immediately adjacent to, the Subject Property does not conform to the District standard profile for the slope of the bank; and

WHEREAS, District has agreed at Permittee's request to provide a waiver to permit the canal to remain in the current configuration, conditioned upon Permittee agreeing to provide a hold harmless agreement for any potential impacts resulting from the existing profile of the slope and further agreeing to maintain canal in its current configuration; and

WHEREAS, Permittee has agreed to provide this Agreement per the District's condition;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the issuance of a surface water permit and the mutual agreements herein, Permittee agrees as follows:

- 1. <u>RECITALS.</u> The above recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein.
- 2. <u>SUBJECT PROPERTY DESCRIPTION.</u> The legal description of the Subject Property is:

SEE **EXHIBIT A** ATTACHED HERETO.

Broward County Property Appraiser ID #: 4841 28 03 6150

3. <u>CONDITION OF CANAL BANK.</u> The Permittee agrees to maintain the canal bank within, or immediately adjacent to the Subject Property, in its current condition, and further agrees to correct any future damage to the canal bank, regardless of how such damage arose. The District agrees to permit the canal to remain in its current condition, provided that any additional damage to the canal or canal bank is corrected within thirty (30) days after written notice to the Permittee or its successor in title, which written notice shall be sent certified mail, return receipt requested to the address of the Permittee or its successor in title as set forth in the records of the Broward County Property Appraiser.

4. INDEMNITY/HOLD HARMLESS.

(a) Permittee expressly agrees to the following:

Permittee assumes all risks and hazards incidental to Permittee's construction and operation of the surface water system, specifically including the current configuration of the canals on and adjacent to the Subject Property. Permittee does hereby agree to waive, release, absolve, indemnify, defend and hold harmless the District, its Board of Supervisors, officers, employees, agents and attorneys of, from and against all liability and expense, including reasonable attorney's fees, in connection with any and all third-party claims, demands, damages, actions, causes of action, and suits in equity of whatever kind or nature, including claims for personal injury, property damage, equitable relief, or loss of use, arising out of Permittee's construction and operation of the surface water management system as permitted. Permittee's liability hereunder shall include all reasonable attorneys' fees and costs incurred by the District in the enforcement of this indemnification provision. This indemnification includes claims made by the employees of the Permittee against the District and the Permittee hereby waives its entitlement, if any, to immunity under Section 440.11, Florida Statutes. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, Permittee's liability shall be limited to the District's actual out-of-pocket damages and expenses, and shall not include special, consequential, or punitive damages, or damages or expenses resulting from the District's gross negligence or intentional wrongful acts. The obligations contained in this provision shall not be limited by the amount of any insurance required to be obtained or maintained under this Agreement. This provision shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

(b) Nothing contained in the foregoing indemnifications shall be construed to be a waiver of any immunity or limitation of liability the District may be entitled to under the doctrine of sovereign immunity or Section 768.28, Florida Statutes.

(c) Permittee agrees to repair or replace any damage to any real or personal property of the District directly caused by the actions or omissions of the Permittee, its officers, officials, employees, agents and participants in the installation and operation of the surface water system, or resulting from the configuration of the canal bank.

<u>5.</u> <u>TERMINATION.</u> This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect until such time as the Permittee or its successor in title receives authorization from the District to restore the canal bank consistent with District Standards and completes all restoration work.

6. <u>AGREEMENT TO RUN WITH THE LAND.</u> This agreement shall run with the land and be binding upon, inure to the benefit of, and be enforceable against all parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns. The obligations of Permittee or any successor in title to Permittee under this Agreement shall terminate upon conveyance of the Subject Property by such party.

7. <u>REGULATION COMPLIANCE.</u> During the performance of this Agreement, Permittee agrees to abide by any and all administrative, operational, and safety rules and regulations established by the District, its agents and/or employees in the permitting, construction and operation of the surface water system. Any breach of any rule or regulation established by the District (except those conditions specifying canal bank slope standards waived by this Agreement relating to the configuration of the canal) shall result in an immediate termination of the waiver granted and may, in the District's sole discretion, mandate the reconstruction of the canal to the District standard configuration and slope.

Pursuant to the provisions contained in the "Contract for Professional Engineering Consulting and Design-Build Services on a Continuing Contract Basis " between the <u>CORAL SPRINGS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT</u>, hereinafter referred to as "OWNER", and <u>Globaltech, Inc.</u>, hereinafter referred to as "FIRM", dated <u>July 1</u>, <u>2012</u> (hereinafter referred to as "AGREEMENT"), this Work Authorization authorizes the FIRM to provide services under the terms and conditions set forth herein and in the AGREEMENT, which is incorporated herein by reference as though set forth in full.

The OWNER desires design-build services related to <u>CSID WTP Sulfuric Acid</u> <u>Tank Inspection</u>, hereinafter referred to as the "Specific Project".

Section 1 – Terms

The FIRM shall be defined as an individual, corporation or contractor having a direct contract with the OWNER or with any other subcontractor in the performance of a part of the work contracted for under the terms of this Work Authorization with the OWNER.

Section 2 – Scope of Work

The FIRM will provide the following services in accordance with Section 1 and 2 of the AGREEMENT.

Background

The CSID Water Treatment Plant (WTP) 4,000-gallon steel sulfuric-acidtank is approximately ten (10) years old, and based on the tank manufacturer's recommendations, the plant staff needs to have an inspection performed to evaluate the condition of the steel tank and it's coatings, both inside and outside the tank.

This Work Authorization includes cleaning and inspection of the acid bulk tank as well as construction of a temporary bulk acid storage system while the existing bulk tank is out of service. To complete this work, the FIRM is planning on using the services of an acid tank cleaning firm, Cliff Berry, Inc. (CBI) and a metal and coatings inspection firm, Corrosion Probe, Inc. (CPI).

The specific plan to complete this work is as follows:

- 1. OWNER will deliver one full sulfuric acid tote and set it in the acid metering pump room.
- 2. The FIRM will pipe up the acid tote discharge to the metering pumps suction piping with CPVC pipe and valves. The piping connection will allow the metering pumps to be fed from either the bulk tank or the temporary tote.
- 3. OWNER will deliver and set up empty totes near the bulk tank.
- 4. OWNER will use the acid in the bulk tank down to about the level of the top of the outlet pipe. Since the top of the outlet pipe is about 8inches above the tank floor there will still be about 250 gallons of acid remaining in the tank. The FIRM will then transfer the remaining usable acid in the bulk tank to the totes. It is likely that near the bottom there will be some residue/detritus that should not be re-used.
- 5. OWNER will close the acid tank valves and have one empty tote (275-gallon disposal tote) delivered to bulk tank location that will be used to collect the residue and cleanings from the bulk tank.
- 6. The FIRM will open the manway on top of the tank.
- 7. The FIRM will have the Subcontractor (CBI) transfer/drain the remaining usable acid into the acid tote that will be pumped backed into the bulk tank at the end of the project. CBI will then pump the non-reusable acid and residue in the bulk tank into the disposal tote, enter and clean the tank. The acid residues and tank cleanings will be placed into the acid disposal tote. This proposal is based on a maximum of one (1) 275-gallon disposal tote and a maximum of two (2) 10-hour workdays for tank draining and cleaning. Subcontractor (CBI) will properly dispose of one (1) 275-gallon acid disposal tote
- 8. The FIRM will have the Subconsultant (CPI) inspect the tank (inside and outside) in one day. The FIRM will provide a ladder into tank, a confined space blower, an air quality meter and one person who will

stay on top of the tank (outside of the tank) for confined space requirements.

- 9. After the inspection is complete, The FIRM will remove the ladder and confined space equipment and bolt the manway cover back on.
- 10. OWNER will transfer the acid from the acid totes back into the bulk tank. OWNER will be responsible for disposing of the empty acid totes.
- 11. The FIRM will remove the temporary drain and bulk tank piping, disconnect the temporary acid tote and reconnect the metering pumps to bulk tank.
- 12. OWNER will open the bulk tank valves and place the bulk tank back into operation.
- 13. The FIRM will submit an inspection report with photographs and measurements along with potential repair recommendations, if any, to OWNER.

Task 1 – Engineering Services

This task includes project management and engineering services required to complete the project.

Engineering and Project Management

- 1. Attend preliminary scoping meeting with the OWNER.
- 2. Coordinate with the OWNER and inspection subconsultant (CPI) and cleaning subcontractor (CBI).
- 3. Arrange for subconsultant (CPI) to enter tank and perform inspection of the inside and outside of the tank.
- 4. Submit tank inspection report with recommendations.

Task 2 – Construction Services

This task entails performing the work to clean and inspect the bulk tank. The work, in general consists of the following:

- 1. Connect and disconnect temporary bulk tank to the existing acid metering pumps suction piping.
- 2. Finish emptying the acid bulk tank.
- 3. Clean existing acid bulk tank.

- 4. Provide confined space equipment and a watch-person during tank entering activities.
- 5. Dispose of one (1) 275-gallon acid residue/cleanings tote.

Assumptions

Assumptions for the project are as follows:

- Cleaning of the tank will not take more than two (2) 10-hour workdays.
 Additional cleaning days will be \$6,210 per day for CBI's services plus potentially additional time for the FIRM's staff.
- The FIRM will be responsible for only one (1) 275-gallon waste acid tote. Additional totes can be disposed of for \$2,415 per tote, plus potentially additional time for the FIRM's staff.
- All material that is to be removed from the inside of the tank is pumpable.
- The OWNER is responsible for moving or repositioning the totes.

Section 3 – Location

The services to be performed by the FIRM shall be at the following location:

• CSID Water Treatment Plant

Section 4 – Deliverables

The FIRM will provide the following Deliverables to OWNER:

• Sulfuric Acid Tank Inspection Report.

Section 5 – Time of Performance

Project will commence after execution of this Work Authorization and a Notice to Proceed is issued by OWNER. The FIRM and OWNER agree to the following schedule:

Task	Time Elapsed from NTP
Notice to Proceed (NTP)	0 Days
Mobilization	8 weeks
Cleaning and Inspection	9 weeks
Submit Inspection Report	12 weeks

The actual cleaning and inspection work will be completed in about one (1) week. The work should be coordinated with when a low volume of acid is in the bulk acid tank. The OWNER should schedule their acid delivery to coincide with the planned work schedule. The work start time can be delayed to meet the acid delivery schedule; however, the FIRM will still need about 30 days to coordinate the cleaning and inspection firms being at the site during the same week.

Section 6 – Method and Amount of Compensation

- The FIRM shall be paid by the OWNER in accordance with the Florida's Prompt Payment Act Florida Statute 218.70-79 and in accordance with the payment method as set forth in Section 6 of the AGREEMENT. The calculations shall begin using the date the invoice was received.
- 2. Total job price: **\$56,023** which includes an allowance of \$10,000 for unforeseen conditions.
- 3. On the terms contained in the FIRM's said proposal for the doing of said work and the said award therefore, and the specifications herein specifically referred to and made a part of this contract.
- 4. The cost for the above scope of services is a lump sum (LS). The LS is based on the materials, methods, and assumptions presented in the scope of services and may be adjusted based on final detail design and alternative selections or omissions. The LS shall not be greater than the stated amount unless there is an approved increase in the scope of services.
- 5. A Budget Summary for the above LS is provided in Attachment A.

Section 7 – Application for Progress Payment

- Unless otherwise prescribed by law, at the end of each month, the FIRM shall submit to the OWNER for review, an Application for Progress Payment filled out and signed by the FIRM covering the Work completed as of the date of the Application and accompanied by such supporting documentation as is required by the AGREEMENT.
- The Application for Progress Payment shall identify the amount of the FIRM Total Earnings to Date based upon value of original contract Work performed to date as approved by fully executed Change Orders.
- 3. Payment shall be based upon percentage of work completed based upon the approved schedule of values. Retainage in the amount of 10% will be withheld on the calculated value of any work, with the exception of stored materials which may be paid at the supplier's invoiced cost. At FIRM's request, after 50% completion of the work has been achieved, the OWNER will implement a reduction in retainage to 5% of all future pay requests. If retainage is reduced, FIRM may not withhold more than 5% retainage from subcontractors or suppliers and will be required to certify compliance with F.S. 218.70 et seq on each subsequent pay application. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in no instance can the amount retained be less than the value of OWNER's good faith claims plus the value of the work the OWNER determines remains to be put in place or required to be performed as remedial activities. For the purposes of this section, 50% completion shall be that point in time when OWNER determines that half of the Work required by the Contract has been completed. In no event shall the Work be determined to be 50% completed before the OWNER has paid 50% of the Contract amount and 50% of the Contract time has expired. The amount of previous Pay Estimate payments shall then be subtracted to equal the Balance Due during the Pay Estimate period.
- 4. When the OWNER determines the Work to be Substantially Complete, the OWNER may reduce the retainage to five percent (5%) of the dollar value of all Work satisfactorily completed to date, provided that the FIRM is

making satisfactory progress toward Final Completion of the Work, that in the opinion of both the Engineer and the OWNER there is no specific cause for a greater retainage, and the FIRM obtains the written consent of the Surety Companies furnishing the required Public Construction Bond on consent forms provided by the OWNER. The OWNER may reinstate the retainage up to ten percent (10%) if the OWNER determines, at its discretion or the Engineer's discretion, that the FIRM is not making satisfactory progress toward final completion of the Work or where there is other specific cause for such withholding.

- 5. Partial payment may be made for the delivered cost of stored materials planned for incorporation into the Work, provided such materials meet the requirements of this Contract, the Contract Drawings, and the Specifications, and are delivered and suitably stored at the project site, or at another location acceptable to the OWNER. Such material must be stored in a secure manor acceptable to the OWNER, and in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations.
- 6. The delivered cost of such stored or stockpiled materials may be included in any subsequent application for payment provided the FIRM meets the following conditions:
 - An applicable purchase order or supplier's invoice is provided listing the materials in detail, the cost of each item, and identifies this specific contract by name.
 - b. The materials are fully insured against loss or damage (from whatever source) or disappearance prior to incorporation into the Work.
 - c. Stored materials approved for payment by the OWNER shall not be removed from the designated storage area except for incorporation into the Work.
 - d. Evidence that the FIRM has verified quantity and quality of the materials delivered (verified packing list).

- 7. It is further agreed between the parties that the transfer of title and the OWNER's payment for any stored or stockpiled materials pursuant to these General Conditions, and any applicable provisions of the Supplementary General Conditions, shall in no way relieve the FIRM of the responsibility of ensuring the correctness of those materials and for furnishing and placing such materials in accordance with the requirements of this Contract, the Contract Drawings, the Technical Specifications, and any approved changes thereto.
- 8. The following monthly Application for Progress Payment shall be accompanied by Bills of Sale, copies of paid invoices, releases of lien, or other documentation warranting that the FIRM has received the stored materials and equipment free and clear of all liens, charges, security interests, and encumbrances (which are hereinafter in these General Conditions referred to as "Liens") and evidence that the stored materials and equipment are covered by appropriate property insurance and other arrangements to protect the OWNER's interest therein, all of which shall be satisfactory to the OWNER.
- 9. The FIRM shall warrant and guarantee that title to all Work, materials, and equipment covered by an Application for Progress Payment, whether incorporated in the Work or not, will pass to the OWNER no later than the time of Final Payment free and clear of all liens or other encumbrances.
- 10. The Engineer shall, within ten (10) days after receipt of each Application for Progress Payment, either indicate in writing a recommendation of payment and present the Application to the OWNER, or return the Application to the FIRM indicating in writing the Engineer's reasons for refusing to recommend payment. In the latter case, the FIRM may make the necessary corrections and resubmit the Application. Twenty (20) days after presentation of the application for progress payment to the OWNER with the Engineer's recommendation, the amount approved will

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(subject to the provisions of the following Paragraph) become due and when due will be paid by the OWNER to the FIRM.

In the event any dispute with respect to any payment or pay request cannot be resolved between the Contractor and Owner's project staff, Contractor may, in accordance with the alternative dispute resolution requirements of Florida Statute section 218.72, *et seq*, demand in writing a meeting with and review by the OWNER'S (agency) director. In the absence of the agency director, a deputy director may conduct the meeting and review. Such meeting and review shall occur within ten (10) business days of receipt by OWNER of FIRM's written demand. The OWNER's manager, shall issue a written decision on the dispute within ten (10) business days of such meeting. This decision shall be deemed the OWNER's final decision for the purposes of the Local Government Prompt Payment Act.

11. The OWNER may refuse to make payment of the full amount recommended by the Engineer because claims have been made against the OWNER on account of the FIRM's performance of the Work, or because Liens have been filed in connection with the Work, or there are other items entitling the OWNER to a credit against the amount recommended, but the OWNER must give the FIRM written notice within twenty (20) business days after the date on which the invoice is stamped as received (with a copy to the Engineer) which specifies the invoice deficiency and any action necessary to make the invoice complete and proper.

Section 8 – Responsibilities

The FIRM shall, under no circumstance, look to the OWNER to provide any labor or equipment for the FIRM. The FIRM shall provide all of the labor and equipment necessary to perform the job or services contracted for at the expense of the FIRM. Property of any kind that may be on the premises, which are the site of the performance of this contract, during the performance of this Work Authorization, shall be at the sole risk of the FIRM.

- **8.1** The OWNER hereby designates <u>Joe Stephens</u> as the OWNER's representative.
- 8.2 In addition to applicable provisions of Section 2 of the AGREEMENT, the OWNER will:
 - Provide copies of existing drawings and equipment cut sheets if requested by FIRM

The FIRM acknowledges and understands that it is an independent contractor in its relationship with the OWNER. The FIRM hereby designates <u>David Schuman</u> as the FIRM's representative.

Section 9 – Insurance

The FIRM shall provide certificate of insurance to the OWNER setting forth the type and amount of insurance carried by the FIRM and conforming to the minimum requirements set forth in the AGREEMENT.

Section 10 – Level of Service

The OWNER shall have the right to terminate said Agreement by giving the FIRM <u>thirty (30)</u> days written notice if the service that is being provided is not maintained at levels necessary to provide the required service. The OWNER will determine in its sole judgment what constitutes a satisfactory level of service.

Section 11 – Indemnification

The Firm shall indemnify and hold harmless the Owner and its officers and employees as set forth in Section 11 of the Agreement.
