

Dear residents:


You probably didn't realize it, but starting in October 2013, CSID has been supplying the District with water produced from our new water treatment plant which uses R/O (reverse osmosis) technology.

In addition to the new water treatment plant, our capital improvement project also included a new wastewater treatment plant and upgrades to the electronics and computer processing for the wastewater department.

We know that most residents have never had the opportunity to visit a water or wastewater treatment plant and we trust that you will be very impressed when viewing the treatment process. Our goal is that you will have a better understanding of all the new technologies at work. To accomplish this, we will hold an OPEN HOUSE on April 5th from 10 am-2 pm where we will provide on-going 15-20 minute mini-seminars with our licensed employees who will give a brief overview of the water, wastewater, drainage and field service processes. There will also be a brief Q & A session after each mini-seminar. Each seminar will be conducted where the process takes place so you will be viewing the sewage treatment plants from the catwalk above the 1.5 million gallon tank and you will be in the water treatment building with the "R/O trains" where your drinking water is made.

So stop by and enjoy some refreshments, meet the members of the Board of Supervisors, get information from the utility staff, and take home an official CSID memento. Hope to see you there!

Parks and Green spaces Donated to the City

CSID would like to congratulate the City of Coral Springs on its 50th anniversary. The Coral Springs Improvement District is proud to have been a part of making the City what it is today and we are happy to have greatly contributed to the quality of life within the City of Coral Springs.

Coral Springs is one of the prime cities in Broward County in which to live. Did you know that many of the parks and green spaces in the City were donated to the City by the Coral Springs Improvement District? You may not be aware that in 1980 and 1981 CSID transferred ownership of the park properties it owned to the City of Coral Springs. This transfer included 14 Parks and multiple buffer strips. Below is a list of the over 91 acres of land that CSID gave to the City for parks and green spaces.

- Park 20-Parcel C of Maplewood (4 acres-**Dede Gilmore Memorial Park**; 10201 NW 19 Street)
- Park 23-Parcel T & Par. KK -Cypress Run (16 acres-**Cypress Hammock/Orchid Park**; 1300 Coral Springs Dr.)
- Park 30-Parcel G of Cypress Run (7 acres-**Lakeview Park**; 11501 Lakeview Drive)
- Park 47-Parcel B and C of Cypress Run (3 acres-**Eagle Ridge Park**; 11650 NW 20 Drive)
- Park 56 & 57 Lot 9-10, Block LL of Ramblewood (1 acre-**Ramblewood Park**; 1806 NW 82 Avenue)
- Park 58-Lot 1, Block Y of Ramblewood (1/2 acre-**Countrywood Park**; 8395 NW 14 Court)



A Message from the Board President




I am very proud to announce that after 5 years of planning, construction, and refinements CSID began producing water from our new nano-filtration plant starting in late October and have fully changed over from the old process of treating our water through the lime softening method by November 2013. Nano processing is the latest water treatment technology and CSID is one of only 25 facilities in the Tri-County area to produce water with this technology. With the expertise of the staff from our water division, the water we are producing is indistinguishable in taste, color, ph, and softness from what you have been used to drinking and using.

As mentioned on page one of this Newsletter, we would like to invite all of our residents to our OPEN HOUSE at CSID so we can show off our new treatment plants in the water and wastewater departments. There will be tours, and our expert staff will be available to answer your questions.
