2013 CSID Board of Supervisors Meeting.

FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS

Roll Call

Mr. Cassel called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. and called the roll.

SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS

Approval of the Minutes of the January 28, 2013 Meeting

Mr. Shank stated each Board member received a copy of the minutes of the January 28, 2013 meeting and requested any corrections, additions or deletions.

There not being any,

On MOTION by Mr. Mena seconded by Mr. Holland with all in favor the minutes of the January 28, 2013 meeting were approved.

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

Audience Comments

There not being any, the next item followed.

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Culvert Cleaning Bid

Three bids were submitted and staff recommends the lowest bid from Fish Tec in the amount of \$95,000.

On MOTION by Mr. Mena seconded by Mr. Holland with all in favor the culvert cleaning bid was awarded to Fish Tec in the amount of \$95,000

FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Discussion and Approval of Change in Credit Card Processor

The following was discussed

- The District currently uses PayPal, which does not offer IVR for pay by phone transactions.
- Paymentus has the capability for clients to pay by phone. It uses live District data by way of web server.
- Paymentus offers electronic check payments and accepts Discover; PayPal does not.
- Switching to Paymentus will result in approximate savings of \$1,000 per month.

On MOTION by Mr. Mena seconded by Mr. Shank with all in favor the agreement with Paymentus was approved.

SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Staff Reports

A. Manager

• Participation in the Annual Waterway Cleanup

The District contributes and participates in the Annual Waterway Cleanup every year. District staff is paid overtime to participate; however, there is not much to clean up in the District's waterway because staff regularly cleans and maintains them.

There was Board consensus to contribute financially to the Annual Waterway Cleanup, but not have staff participate.

Consideration of H&H Contract for Alternate Sludge Disposal

The DEP is mandating the District to have an alternative for sludge disposal. The District currently has land application and land fill. The third proposed alternative is to have H&H reserve space in their system in case the first two alternatives are not possible.

On MOTION by Mr. Holland seconded by Mr. Mena with all in favor the agreement with H&H for alternate sludge disposal was approved.

Utility Billing Work Orders

The Board reviewed the work orders. Mr. Shank questioned why January is always significantly higher. Mr. Daly explained most people do not realize houseguests over the holidays increase water usage.

The following was also discussed:

➤ Clean Fuels sporadically tests the District's diesel fuels for contaminates. One of the District's tanks has algae and water in it. It will cost \$2,170 to have it cleaned out.

On MOTION by Mr. Mena seconded by Mr. Holland with all in favor cleaning of one of the District's diesel tanks at a cost of \$2,170 by Clean Fuels was approved.

- > There was discussion regarding odors coming from the water plant.
- ➤ Mr. Cassel reviewed several issues with Well #5 and items needing attention. There will be approximately an additional \$70,000 in expenses. The total cost will be \$100,000 to \$125,000. The cost of a new well is approximately \$250,000.
- > The Board expressed concern about spending more money in well repairs than the estimated amount and questioned at what point is it no longer cost effective.

On MOTION by Mr. Holland seconded by Mr. Mena with all in favor expenses not to exceed \$55,000 were approved to proceed on necessary work for Well #5.

Mr. Cassel and Mr. Lyn reviewed several issues with Well #10. A report outlining the issues discussed is attached hereto and made a part of the public record.

B. Director of Operations

• Water

Mr. Stover reported the following:

- > Things are moving forward with his department.
- > There are several projects in process with positive results.
- Mr. Brown is taking care of projects his company is responsible for.

- > Mr. Lyn made corrections to the initial acid skid drawings. Building will begin in approximately three weeks.
- > Internal flow meters are being checked to see if replacements are necessary.

• Sewer

Mr. McIntosh reported Globaltech completed the sludge lime in Plant F and returned \$7,000 to the District.

Stormwater

Mr. Frederick reported the following:

- > The LP tank project will be completed this week.
- > Installation of telemetry for water elevations will begin this week.
- > The tree project will begin within the next two weeks. Discussion ensued regarding the tree mitigation project and issues with the city.

• Field

Mr. Seigfried provided an update on the lift station project, which is expected to be completed in March.

Mr. Daly updated the Board on an on-campus lift station flood. A pilot light will be installed and monitored by the Wastewater Department.

• Human Resources

Mr. Shank requested an email be sent to all job applicants acknowledging receipt and thanking them for their application.

C. Attorney

Mr. Capko reported the following:

- A proposed canal bank erosion, monitoring and response policy was drafted and sent to staff for comments. A final proposed policy will be presented to the Board at the next meeting.
- A negotiation session will be set up with CH2M Hill to discuss fee issues.

- Consideration of Work Authorization #74 for Well Step-Drawdown Testing The following was discussed:
- Mr. Lyn reviewed Work Authorization #74 for engineering consulting services related to well step-drawdown testing in the amount of \$14,980.

On MOTION by Mr. Mena seconded by Mr. Shank with all in favor Work Authorization #74 in the amount of \$14,980 was approved.

Mr. Lyn is working with Mr. McIntosh on leveling the gate.

WORK AUTHORIZATION

CSID WA # 75 Globaltech No. 120326

Pursuant to the provisions contained in the "Contract for Professional Engineering Consulting and Design-Build Services on a Continuing Contract Basis " between the <u>CORAL SPRINGS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT</u>, hereinafter referred to as "OWNER", and <u>Globaltech, Inc.</u>, hereinafter referred to as "FIRM", dated <u>July 1, 2012</u> (hereinafter referred to as "AGREEMENT"), this Work Authorization authorizes the FIRM to provide services under the terms and conditions set forth herein and in the AGREEMENT, which is incorporated herein by reference as though set forth in full.

The OWNER desires engineering consulting services related to the <u>Water Treatment Plant Well 5 Assistance</u>, hereinafter referred to as the "Specific Project".

Section 1 - Terms

The FIRM shall be defined as an individual, corporation or contractor having a direct contract with the OWNER or with any other subcontractor in the performance of a part of the work contracted for under the terms of this Work Authorization with the OWNER.

Section 2 – Scope of Work

The FIRM will provide the following services in accordance with the AGREEMENT:

Well 5 is currently being re-constructed by Aquifer Maintenance and Performance Systems, Inc. (AMPS) after a crack was discovered in the well casing. CSID contracted AMPS to install new casing and screen, develop the well, and raise the well head. The OWNER has requested

that the FIRM in conjunction with Connect Consulting Inc. (CCI) provide technical support to CSID staff during the re-construction of the well.

Task 1 – Well Development and Pumping Test

The Firm will provide limited on-site oversight for the well development and pumping tests for Well 5. Based on site visits and information provided by AMPS and CSID, the Firm will provide recommendations to CSID regarding the development of the well. Up to 3 site visits to the well are anticipated during well development and final pumping tests. The Firm will also meet with staff to coordinate driller activities and review recommendations. Memos or emails summarizing the work and recommendations are to be provided.

Task 2 - Well Head Permitting

Well 5 had a few regulatory and operational issues that can be addressed with piping changes when the well is reconstructed. However, these piping changes will require a Broward County Health Department (BCHD) Permit. The Firm will provide a BCHD permit application and drawing of the new well head configuration for submittal to BCHD. Once the changes are complete, the Firm will provide BCHD clearance documents for the new well head configuration and a record drawing. CSID shall be responsible for permit fees and water quality sampling/reporting associated with the well.

Assumptions

Assumptions for the project are as follows:

- FIRM is not responsible for obtaining planning, zoning, or building permits for this work.
- FIRM is responsible of preparing Broward County Health Department
 Permit Application. Broward County Health Department permit

application fees will paid by OWNER. OWNER will provide assistance in expediting BCHD and applicable agencies where possible.

- No new survey is required for design or record drawings.
- Construction of improvements is to be performed by others.
- Additional work including construction work can be conducted using the allowance or change order with prior approval of OWNER.

Section 3 – Location

The services to be performed by the FIRM shall be on the following site or sites: Coral Springs Improvement District Water Treatment Plant

Section 4 – Deliverables

The FIRM will provide the following Deliverables to OWNER:

Draft and Final TM

Section 5 – Time of Performance

Project will commence after execution of this Work Authorization. The FIRM and OWNER agree to the following schedule:

Section 6 – Method and Amount of Compensation

- The FIRM shall be paid by the OWNER in accordance with the Florida's Prompt Payment Act Florida Statute 218.70-79 and in accordance with the payment method as set forth in Section 6 of the AGREEMENT. The calculations shall begin using the date the invoice was received.
- 2. Total job price: \$18,912.00. Price includes Allowance of \$3,152.00.

- 3. The cost for the above scope of services is a lump sum (LS). The LS is based on the materials, methods, and assumptions presented in the scope of services. The LS shall not be greater than the stated amount unless there is an approved increase in the scope of services.
- 4. A Budget Summary for the above LS is provided in Attachment A.

Section 7 – Application for Progress Payment

1. Unless otherwise prescribed by law, at the end of each month, the FIRM shall submit to the OWNER for review, an Application for Progress Payment filled out and signed by the FIRM covering the Work completed as of the date of the Application and accompanied by such supporting documentation as is required by the AGREEMENT.

Section 8 – Responsibilities

The FIRM shall, under no circumstance, look to the OWNER to provide any labor or equipment for the FIRM. The FIRM shall provide all of the labor and equipment necessary to perform the job or services contracted for at the expense of the FIRM. Property of any kind that may be on the premises, which are the site of the performance of this contract, during the performance of this Work Authorization, shall be at the sole risk of the FIRM.

- **8.1** The OWNER hereby designates <u>Ed Stover</u> as the OWNER's representative.
- **8.2** In addition to applicable provisions of Section 2 of the AGREEMENT, the OWNER will:
 - Provide copies of existing drawings and equipment cut sheets if requested by FIRM
 - Pay for any required permit fees

The FIRM acknowledges and understands that it is an independent contractor in its relationship with the OWNER. The FIRM hereby designates <u>Troy Lyn</u> as the FIRM's representative.

Section 9 – Insurance

The FIRM shall provide certificate of insurance to the OWNER setting forth the type and amount of insurance carried by the FIRM and conforming to the minimum requirements set forth in the AGREEMENT.

Section 10 – Level of Service

The OWNER shall have the right to terminate said Agreement by giving the FIRM thirty (30) days written notice if the service that is being provided is not maintained at levels necessary to provide the required service. The OWNER will determine in its sole judgment what constitutes a satisfactory level of service.

Section 11 – Indemnification

The Firm shall indemnify and hold harmless the Owner and its officers and employees as set forth in Section 11 of the Agreement.

Pursuant to the provisions contained in the "Contract for Professional Engineering Consulting and Design-Build Services on a Continuing Contract Basis" between the <u>CORAL SPRINGS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT</u>, hereinafter referred to as "OWNER", and <u>Globaltech, Inc.</u>, hereinafter referred to as "FIRM", dated <u>July 1, 2012</u> (hereinafter referred to as "AGREEMENT"), this Work Authorization authorizes the FIRM to provide services under the terms and conditions set forth herein and in the AGREEMENT, which is incorporated herein by reference as though set forth in full.

The OWNER desires engineering consulting services related to the <u>Water Treatment Plant Well 10 Rehabilitation</u>, hereinafter referred to as the "Specific Project".

Section 1 - Terms

The FIRM shall be defined as an individual, corporation or contractor having a direct contract with the OWNER or with any other subcontractor in the performance of a part of the work contracted for under the terms of this Work Authorization with the OWNER.

Section 2 - Scope of Work

The FIRM will provide the following services in accordance with the AGREEMENT:

The water production of Well 10 continues to decline and the submersible pump has failed. The OWNER has requested that the FIRM, in conjunction with Connect Consulting Inc. (CCI), conduct an evaluation of Well 10 and if necessary rehabilitate the well.

Task 1 - Well 10 Evaluation

The Firm will remove the failed submersible pump and motor and conduct a visual and dynamic/static video inspection of the well. CSID will provide and operate video equipment for the video inspection. Maintenance and Performance Systems, Inc. (AMPS) will subcontracted to the Firm to remove the pump and motor and to provide a temporary pump for the dynamic/static test and video inspection. The Firm will provide on-site support during pump removal, borehole video survey, and specific capacity testing. The firm will collect water level and field data as needed. The Firm will review the video and test data to determine an appropriate rehabilitation methodology to be implemented after the evaluation is complete. A TM will summarize the finding and recommendations for the well rehabilitation.

Task 2 – Well 10 Rehabilitation

The results in Task 1 will be used to develop a rehabilitation strategy for Well 10. The rehabilitation methodology will include traditional well rehabilitation techniques such as chemical treatment, air lift development, high pressure jetting, and over pumping. AMPS will be subcontracted to the Firm to provide the following anticipated services.

- Mobilize tank and equipment to site and setup
- Brush well/reverse out debris approximately 12 hours
- Acidize well
- Develop well for up to 20 hours
- Set up temporary pump and perform four hour step test on well
- Reinstall pump and equipment into well
- Perform final pump and well disinfection
- Demobilize tank and equipment and restore site

After well brushing, acidization, and development, a post cleaning video is to be performed. It is assumed that CSID will utilize their video equipment and provide a copy of the video for the Firm's review.

An estimated 48 hours of oversight for rehabilitation activities is anticipated by CCI to document and coordinate with AMPs. On-site services are based on the assumption that the well contractor and drilling crew selected for this project are competent and are capable of completing the project as designed and that the project will be completed under a typical schedule for these services. If additional time beyond CCI estimated time is required, their services will be invoiced at \$123 per hour with pre-approval prior to execution of the additional work.

A TM summarizing the well rehabilitation activities and results will be provided at the conclusion of this Task.

Note that a new pump and motor may be required. It is assumed that the pump and motor will be provided by CSID or the procurement of the pump will be in a separate Work Authorization. The Firm will assist with the selection of the pump and motor based on the pumping test results of the rehabilitation.

Assumptions

Assumptions for the project are as follows:

- FIRM is not responsible for obtaining planning, zoning, or building permits for this work.
- FIRM is not responsible for obtaining Broward County Health Department permits for this work. None are anticipated.
- No new survey or drawings are anticipated.
- If additional time beyond CCI estimated time is required, their services will be invoiced at \$123 per hour with pre-approval prior to execution of the additional work.

 If additional development time is required by AMPs, their services will be invoiced at \$207 per hour with pre-approval prior to execution of the additional work.
