


As a local resident of the City of Coral Springs and the Coral Springs Improvement District (CSID) Service Area we wanted to ensure you were informed of the implementation of the upcoming Tree Inventory Project. The CSID Board of Supervisors, in partnership with and pursuing the objectives of the Resident Advisory Committee report, have approved a Tree Inventory Project for the safety of the community as part of the Windstorm Mitigation Project.

An independent and certified Arborist will provide an assessment of trees and/or vegetation for the Tree Inventory Project within the right-of-way boundary of CSID's 22-mile canal system.

The CSID Arborist will work in partnership with the City of Coral Spring's Forrester to provide an in-depth inventory of the trees, including photographs, descriptions, and detailed area mapping of vegetation located and identified in the CSID right-of-way. This information will be available to inform and educate both the District Staff and residents on how to be responsible stewards for the community.

This environmental partnership program will commence in early April 2024 and last approximately four months (16-weeks). The program will be implemented by dividing the CSID Service Area into four zones: Zone 1, Zone 2, Zone 3, and Zone 4.

The inventory will provide information which will be posted through links on the CSID website. The links will lead to the Arborist's conclusions regarding the condition for all trees located throughout the District's Canal rights-of-way. Information will be available using an interactive "smart map" which will identify



tree species, size, location, and general information about the health of the trees. In addition, the maps will identify ground plantings and shrubs and may provide lists of both invasive species and trees that are susceptible to hurricane damage. The website will also be the source of information regarding upcoming events.

The Tree Inventory Project will have no impact to the trees and vegetation and will serve as an educational benefit to the District and residents of the community. The project is a recommendation of the Residents Advisory Committee and is necessary to help the District and homeowner's manage their trees during the next steps of the Windstorm Mitigation Project.
